

SEAL (Social Emotional Adjustment Learning)

The SEAL program (Social Emotional Adjustment Learning) provides a small group and/or individualized instruction to students who struggle to succeed in the mainstream due to behavioral and/or social/emotional issues. Students are supported by a certified Special Education teacher and support staff.

Students in this program range in cognitive ability from low average, average and high average. Although instruction is individually based, the elementary curriculum is utilized to assist with the goal of attending and transitioning into the mainstream classes.

Support from the School Psychologist is an integral component of the program. He/She will work closely with the special education and general education staff, as appropriate, to ensure consistency amongst behavioral/emotional expectations. Along with the related services support staff, one of the district's BCBA's (Board Certified Behavioral Analysts) consult with teachers and provide services as needed or specified on an individual's IEP.

Students are encouraged to move to mainstream classes when appropriate. In mainstream classes, students continue to be supported and monitored by the SEAL team. This learning environment supports the success of students with a variety of disabilities/classifications and other learning differences.
